Wellness Director's Corner!


This is your friendly reminder that on Monday, October 9th

The Lady with the Lamp

Would the "Florence Nightingale effect" exist if Florence Nightingale never left for Crimea on October 21, 1854? Nightingale and her nurses arrived at the Crimean War hospital in Scutari to find that conditions were so unsanitary that soldiers were dying ten times faster than they should have. Nightingale nearly singlehandedly turned the hospital around, cleaning the rooms, providing laundered clothes and linens to patients, bringing fresher food, flushing out the sewers, and ventilating the rooms. She made her nightly rounds with a handheld light, earning her the nickname the "Lady with the Lamp." Some wonder, did Florence Nightingale fall in love with any of the patients under her care? Records show that Nightingale never married out of fear that it would interrupt her duties as a nurse. Perhaps we should be thankful for that decision, as Nightingale's efforts have earned her renown as the "Founder of Modern Nursing."
